<u>Science – Material World</u>

Reminder...EVERYTHING is made of matter. (There are 3 main types)

SOLIDS LIQUIDS GASSES

- milk
- water
- dishwashing liquid
- any other liquid you would like to test out (check with your grownup first to make sure it is safe)
