As part of the accreditation process, Mrs Ross had to submit multiple sources of evidence to demonstrate:

- an exceptional knowledge of their subject;
- modelling of highly-effective, evidence-based teaching strategies;
- informal or formal leadership roles and outcomes within and beyond their school; and
- successfully initiating opportunities for parents to engage in their children's learning.

SOME THOUGHTS ON BULLYING

Unfortunately, from time to time, all children will experience bullying in different forms - physical, emotional, social, and now, even technological. The school has an important role to play in educating our young students on:

1. Identifying different types of bullying,
2. How they can cope with bullying if they encounter it,
3. How they can report it, and,
4. Ways to avoid further harm or injury.



Our school endeavours to follow up any alleged bullying incidents as quickly as possible. At times, the investigations can be quite complex and time-consuming. There are usually two sides to every story, and parents must be open to the possibility that their child is the actual bully!

To me, bullying is repeated over time, targeted, and usually involves an imbalance of power. At times kids can be unkind to each other - I do not regard this as bullying, but rather a student or students being nasty to each other. If one child continues to target another student, then the 'bullying' tag could be applied.

At Rutherford Public School we encourage all students to report any bullying behaviours, and there are consequences for students who break school rules or expectations.

Parents also have a role to play in raising resilient children. Parents should listen to any concerns and encourage the student to report it immediately. Younger students may require support, and an interview with the class teacher or myself may be appropriate. Telling kids to be confident and strong when being bullied is an important message also, but telling kids to "hit them back" or "stand up to them" may not be the best advice. Violence usually leads to more violence and an escalation of the problem.

Teaching our students to recognise the 'power play' in the interactions is perhaps a far more useful way of equipping children to recognise what is happening to them. Tactical ignoring, walking away and reporting to an adult are far better strategies than using violence and verbal swearing.

I understand that parents are keen to eliminate all forms of bullying in their child's life, but the reality is that bullying can be encountered throughout their life: in high school, university, in public places and the workforce. Teaching our students to cope with bullying and the steps they can take to manage it peacefully will lead to far more resilient and confident adults!

Every school has bullying-type behaviours, but the whole school community's effort to reduce it, is what really matters!

PRIMARY CHOIR

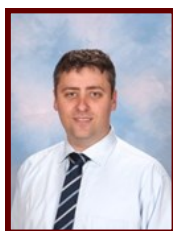

Students in the Middle Years are experiencing a profound transition from childhood to adolescence. They are undergoing significant intellectual, social, physical, emotional, ethical and moral development.

During the Middle Years, students are moving from concrete to abstract thinking. They have an intense curiosity and a growing capacity for higher order analysis and reflection. They are also moving towards more rational decision making and a better understanding of the consequences of behaviour.

Middle Years' students have a growing interest in ethical and moral questions and like exploring real world social issues. Many want to make the world a better place as active, emerging young citizens within our Australian society and global community. For many students, the transition from primary to secondary school can be exciting and smooth sailing. For others, it can be a time of apprehension and anxiety.

Many young adolescents feel an intense need to belong and be accepted by their peers. They strive to be independent, but while outwardly confident, they are often insecure and sensitive to personal criticism. They increasingly turn to their peers to define their language, attitudes, self-image and values. As students in the classroom they seek challenge and engagement. A hands-on approach is often preferred, with the opportunity to have a say in what they learn, how they learn and how they will be assessed. They enjoy working cooperatively with their peers yet also like working independently on individual research and projects.

Middle Years' students are progressively developing the ability to manage their own learning.

Stage 2 will be participating in a four-week tennis program every Friday commencing on 2nd September. All equipment will be supplied, however, students may bring their own racquet if they want.

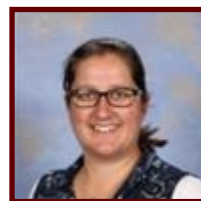
CRICKET



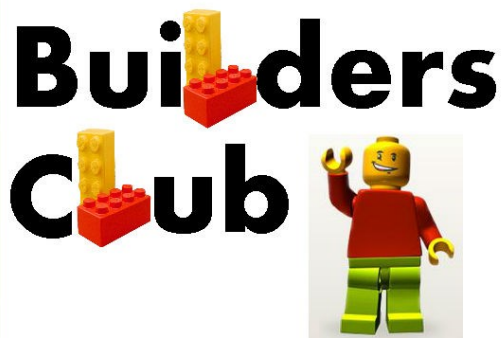
Book Fair
