PLAY TIMES FOR PRIMARY STUDENTS

After a trial of our combined 3-6 lunch and play periods this term, we have decided that in Week 6 we will revert to our 2023 structure, where Years 3 and 4 will have their break times separate to the Years 5 and 6 students. This will reduce the pressure of school playing areas and students accessing areas for games and activities.

DROP OFFS AND PICK UPS

Lately we have had a small number of motorists not following basic road rules and parking restrictions whilst dropping off and collecting students of a morning and afternoon. Rangers and police regularly patrol our school zone and heavy fines apply. All parents and community members are asked to keep the safety of our students as their highest priority.

MOBILE PHONES, SMART WATCHES AND ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Parents and carers will receive an email copy of our mobile phone, smartwatches and electronic devices policy this week. Our school has adopted an 'Off and Away' approach, which means that ALL devices need to be away and turned off in the school playground and classrooms. SCHOOL BYTES PORTAL

Our School Bytes parent app is the main way we communicate securely to all parents and carers. It is essential that at least one parent is linked to each student enrolment.

School Bytes is used to:

- Send and receive permission notes e.g. excursions, incursions and sporting events
- Collect payment of fees and school activities
- Record attendance and explain absences
- Issue and view student progress semester reports

From the School Bytes Dashboard you can access your child's statement of account, payment history, activities, newsletter, reports, view the calendar and attendance and respond to absences. We ask that you turn your push notifications to 'ON' so you can receive important information as it is sent out.

Teachers use this information throughout the year to manage student activities. Parents and carers are asked to complete these forms by Friday 1st March 2024. STUDENT HEALTH

Has your child's health needs changed over the school break? It is important that the school has up-to-date information about student health needs. Allergies and other medical conditions need to be managed by the school. Please contact the school immediately if you need to update our school records.

OUR KINNECTION

The Our Kinnection program is up and running each Tuesday, facilitated by Joey and Vicki Griffiths. All students K-6 who identify as Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander are part of the program. If you do not wish for your child to attend the fortnightly program, please contact the office on 4932 5900.

The Rutherford Public School Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Dance group, known as the 'Deadly Dance Group' is looking for committed students and families to share their knowledge and culture and represent our school at community and whole events. An expression of interest to be part of the 'Deadly Dance Group' will be coming home with students next Tuesday. Please return the slip at the bottom expressing your interest to the office. There will be a K-2 and 3-6 group with approximately 25 students in each group.

EXTERNAL PROVIDERS

A friendly reminder that any external provider (e.g. NDIS support, Speech Therapist, Occupational Therapist etc) seeking to support students during school hours school must liaise with classroom teachers regarding the days and times.

An application for their service during school hours must also be completed and approved by the Infant or Primary Deputy Principals. In most cases, these applications are approved, but school timetabling and possible other school organisation may mean some negotiation of the requests. We are committed to providing the best education for all students following a rigorous curriculum.

VOLUNTEER INDUCTIONS

Thank you to the parents who have come along and been inducted into our school site. The induction of all volunteers is mandatory at all public schools throughout NSW. The induction only takes around 15 minutes and gives our valued volunteers some basic information of policies and school operational procedures. This induction is only required for NEW parents, carers and visitors to our school. You will need to complete a working with children declaration and provide 100 points of identification.

Our next Volunteer Induction session will be held Tuesday 27th February 2024 at 3:20pm in the Community Room.

Volunteers who have completed the induction <u>in the last five years</u> do not need to attend the sessions, but MUST wear their volunteer lanyard at all times whilst volunteering in the school. Parents and carers do not need to register for the induction.

NAPLAN

This term, students in Years 3 and 5 will undertake NAPLAN assessment. NAPLAN provides schools with valuable information about your child's learning progress in literacy and numeracy. NAPLAN is only one way we assess student learning. The NAPLAN window will take place from Wednesday 13th March 2024 to Monday 25th March 2024.

Year 3 and 5 catch up assessments for absent students will occur from Wednesday 20th March 2024 to Friday 22nd March 2024.

Your child's teacher is getting students ready for NAPLAN and will provide appropriate support and guidance. Students will become familiar with the types of questions in the tests and the online testing.

<u>FREE Toast and Milo</u> will be available to all students in Years 3 and 5 on NAPLAN testing days from the Community Room.

MUSIC NEWS

The Instrumental Music Program returned in Week 4 with 140 students involved in Violin, Trumpet and Drum Corps lessons.

A reminder that there is an information session for new families joining the program, to be held on Tuesday 27th February 2024 in the Community Room at 6pm. The meeting will go for approximately 45 minutes.

Music fees will be due in Week 5 this term. The term fee is \$40 and is payable through School Bytes. Instrument Hire Agreements will go home early next week for violin and trumpet students.

LIBRARY NEWS

Thank you to everyone who made orders through Book Club. They have started to go home this week and will continue into next week.

Borrowing has started, so please remember to send a library bag with your child in Kindergarten to Year 2 and encourage your children to borrow and read from Kindergarten through to Year 6.

Library lessons will occur once per fortnight, Infants in Even weeks and Primary in Odd weeks. If books are lost, broken or damaged on return, please help your child learn responsibility through paying for the book's replacement, or sending in a book of <u>great</u> quality to replace the damaged book.

COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE & TRAVEL

Compulsory School Attendance

NSW public schools work in partnership with parents to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier, and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school. An Application for Extended Leave may need to be completed and approved by the Principal. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year. In some circumstances students may be eligible to enroll in distance education for travel periods over fifty school days. This should be discussed with your child's school Principal.

LEARNING SUPPORT TEAM

Our School Learning Support Team (LST) is designed and operates to support all students in their learning. The LST meets weekly and consists of several school staff (executives, counsellors, and teachers) who meet every week to discuss students' academic, behavioural, social and emotional needs.

From time-to-time, classroom teachers will refer individual students to the LST for additional assessment, support and advice. The LST may offer additional advice to the class teacher on how best to support a student, refer a student to the school counselling team or even seek advice from specialist services and advisors from the Department of Education.

Parents and carer consultation is an important part of the Learning and Support team process and planning. Parent review meetings are sometimes arranged to ensure all planning is inclusive and consultative. Our two main Learning Support Teams are chaired by Mrs Zoe Dyall (Deputy Principal - Head of Infants) and Mrs Belinda Lantry (Deputy Principal - Head of Primary).
